Early Intervention Services for Children with Communication Disorders

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

The SLP assumes various roles in addressing the needs of infants and toddlers with communication disorders, including screening and identification, assessment and evaluation, planning intervention, direct service delivery and monitoring of treatment programs as well as case management and consultation. This course details many of the unique features of providing services to children birth to three and discusses the efficacy of these services.

Practical suggestions for dealing with the unique needs of these children and their families will be shared. Approaches to the assessment of communication skills in young children are addressed and expected communication problems related to specific medical disorders are highlighted. Participants will be given the opportunity to practice developing treatment plans and selecting activities to address three areas of communication skills: prelinguistic; receptive language; expressive language.

Suggestions will be made for adapting treatment plans into strategies and activities for families to implement, and participants will be given the opportunity to apply these suggestions.
