

## Immediate Jeopardy Trends by Tag Long Term Care Newsletter Article

A review of data collected from August 2012 through January 2013 revealed that the most commonly cited IJ tags were:

- **CFR 483.75/Tag 0490:** A facility must be administered in a manner that enables it to use its resources effectively and efficiently to attain or maintain the highest practicable physical, mental, and psychosocial well-being of each resident.
- **CFR 483.25(h)/Tag 0323:** The facility must ensure that the resident environment remains as free of accident hazards as is possible; and each resident receives adequate supervision and assistance devices to prevent accidents.
- **CFR 483.20/Tag 0282:** The services provided or arranged by the facility must be provided by qualified persons in accordance with each resident's written plan of care.
- **CFR 483.20(d)(3), CFR 483.10(k)(2)/Tag 0280:** The resident has the right, unless adjudged incompetent or otherwise found to be incapacitated under the laws of the State, to participate in planning care and treatment or changes in care and treatment.
- **CFR 483.25/Tag 0309:** Each resident must receive and the facility must provide the necessary care and services to attain or maintain the highest practicable physical, mental, and psychosocial well-being, in accordance with the comprehensive assessment and plan of care.
- **CFR 483.75(o)(1)/Tag 0520:** A facility must maintain a quality assessment and assurance committee consisting of the director of nursing services; a physician designated by the facility; and at least 3 other members of the facility's staff.
- **CFR 483.13/Tag 0224:** The Facility must ensure the prohibition of mistreatment/neglect/misappropriation.
- **CFR 483.13(c)/Tag 0226:** The facility must develop and implement written policies and procedures that prohibit mistreatment, neglect, and abuse of residents and misappropriation of resident property. A comprehensive care plan must be developed within 7 days after the completion of the comprehensive assessment; prepared by an interdisciplinary team, that includes the attending physician, a registered nurse with responsibility for the resident, and other appropriate staff in disciplines as determined by the resident's needs, and, to the extent practicable, the participation of the resident, the resident's family or the resident's legal representative; and periodically reviewed and revised by a team of qualified persons after each assessment.
