Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program



Your child may qualify for free or low cost health insurance through the Kentucky Children's Health Insurance Program (KCHIP).

KCHIP is for children younger than 19 years old who do not have health insurance. Families must meet certain income guidelines to qualify. See the table to find out if your child qualifies:
