Guiding Principles in Measure Selection - Massachusetts


Massachusetts, a SIM testing state, used the following guidelines in selecting measures for their Primary Care Payment Reform (PCPR) initiative.

Statewide Quality Advisory Committee (SQAC)

- The Massachusetts SQAC was established through legislation and seeks to define a standard list of health care quality measures.
- Goals:
 1. Reduce the provider reporting burden
 2. Ensure that the strongest quality measures are in use
 3. Give consumers the confidence to compare provider quality



Guiding Principles in Measure Selection - Oregon

As a result of the SIM initiative, Oregon passed House Bill 2118 in 2013, which created the Health Plan Quality Metrics Work Group. This workgroup is responsible for recommending appropriate health plan quality measures.

Health Plan Quality Metrics Work Group Measure Selection Process



Guiding Principles in Measure Selection – Oregon *(continued)*

The workgroup identified four goals needed to achieve the Triple Aim in Oregon. They then identified four criteria to ensure the measures were relevant to all stakeholders in the health care system.

Goals for Achieving Triple Aim

1

Provide a better future for today's kids by investing in the health of future generations

2

Ensure access to high quality care

3

Promote integration and holistic care

4

Reduce costs and make health care sustainable



Guiding Principles in Measure Selection - Michigan



Stakeholder Variation in Measure Goals

Developing SMART Goals for Quality Measurement

The SMART framework should be used in determining the principles that will guide the development of quality goals for the SIM initiative.



To be successful, the stakeholder-developed goals and objectives for SIM should be consistent with the **SMART** methodology.

SMART Model Design Goals



Design episode-based payment models to complement PCMH activities by adding cost accountability. Launch five episodes in the first year.



Reduce the rate of growth in health care costs for the state as a whole to the Consumer Price Index within three years.



Develop and implement 75 episodes of care within five years , with new episodes being rolled out every six months.


