


KPAP

The Kentucky Prescription Assistance Program is a service that helps qualified people obtain their prescription medications through the medication assistance programs offered by drug companies.

- ◆ Patient eligibility for the program is based on income guidelines, set by each individual drug manufacturer. Usually between 200-400% of the federal poverty level.
- ◆ Most programs allow insured patients to participate as long as they do not have coverage for the requested medication.
- ◆ Most programs allow undocumented patients.
- ◆ Even senior citizens in the Medicare “doughnut hole” may be eligible.

WHAT IS KPAP?



The Kentucky Prescription Assistance Program (KPAP) helps the public access prescription drug programs offered by the drug manufacturers, discount drug programs, and discount pharmacy programs. By partnering with local organizations, qualifying individuals and/or their families can access available prescription drugs free or at reduced costs.

How The Program Works >>>

The program uses a “high tech – high touch” approach to coordinate existing assistance programs offered by prescription drug companies, reducing paperwork through web-based technology and streamlining the process. The prescriber is asked to sign the completed form(s) at no charge.

Governor Steve Beshear introduced the Kentucky Prescription Assistance Program (KPAP) in October 2008. The purpose of the program is to aid Kentuckians in locating free or reduced cost prescription drugs.

Become a KPAP Partner—FREE

KPAP Community Consultants are available to meet with you and your agency upon request to discuss becoming a KPAP partner site. Becoming a KPAP site provides you with:

- ◆ Web-based Med. Assistance software
- ◆ Sample Tracking software
- ◆ Training
- ◆ Technical Assistance

Community Consultants collaborate with your site for training and technical assistance. Community Consultants are available to offer as much or as little assistance as need. From training, to helping develop a community volunteer network to staff the program.

Who Can Be a Partner?

Physician Offices, Pharmacies, Hospitals, Mental Health Professionals, Free Clinics, Faith Based organizations, Social Service Agencies, Governmental agencies, etc.

Really, What’s The Catch?

There isn’t any catch!! We require the patient being assisted not be charged for the assistance. We also ask that your aggregate data be allowed to be combined with other KPAP sites for tracking and reporting purposes. As of October 2014, KPAP has obtained nearly a half a Billion dollars in free medications for Kentuckians.



How Do We Help?

The cost of medication can be a heavy financial burden even with insurance benefits. Many of the major pharmaceutical companies provide some type of patient assistance programs (PAPs) to assist with the cost of medication, even for insured patients. KPAP provides software, training, and technical assistance to partners for FREE to streamline the process so patients can access their medications.
