STRATEGIC INITIATIVE 1 – STRENGTHENING OUR INFRASTRUCTURE

Project Description	Status
E-Onsite – launch E-Onsite to support implementation and documentation of new on-site regulations.	
Sustainable Public Health Funding – continue to secure, maintain and increase state public health funding. This is an on-going project.	
Performance Management and Program Evaluation – develop and implement department-wide system for program evaluation and performance management.	
Web Redesign – update Public Health's web site to improve ease of navigation, readability and interactivity, and capacity to support 24/7 communication.	
Develop Policies and Procedures in Highest Risk Program Areas – ensure written policies and procedures are in place for EPH and other high risk program areas.	
Cross Cultural Training and Awareness – via the Diversity and Quality Team, implement a department-wide cross cultural training and awareness program.	
Grants/Contract Development – implement a system to research, coordinate, develop, and submit grants.	
Data Warehouse – develop centralized storage of electronic community health datasets accessible to all staff.	
GIS Mapping – synchronize public health data with GIS mapping to support outbreak surveillance, client tracking, response to emergencies, and on-site septic systems.	
Web EOC – explore development of a web-based Emergency Operations Center to manage resources during an emergency.	
Multi Media Exploration – implement innovative multi-media and computing technologies to improve internal and external communications.	

STRATEGIC INITIATIVE 2 – RESPONDING TO HEALTH THREATS

Project Description	Status
HANS/SECURES – develop, implement and exercise a redundant public health emergency notification system.	
Joint Information Center/Joint Information System (JIC/JIS) – develop, implement and exercise a JIS with partners and Region IV, and identify, equip and maintain operational readiness of JIC.	
Mass Dispensing – obtain policy direction on items to stockpile, procure, inventory, store, refresh, and deploy during emergencies.	
Response Plans – develop and update an all-hazard emergency response plan along with specific annexes for respiratory diseases, radiological, chemical, and bioterrorism.	
ESF-8 and EOC Readiness – develop and maintain operational readiness of the ESF-8 desk and EOC support for Clark and Skamania counties.	
Improve Disease Surveillance System – improve passive and active disease surveillance system to foster earlier disease recognition and reporting.	
PHEPR Exercise Program – develop, implement and evaluate a preparedness exercise program that trains staff and community partners, and tests those plans and the communications and operations to successfully prepare, respond, recover, and mitigate.	
Preparedness Outreach – define and identify "vulnerable populations" (VP) and develop ongoing relationships with and support to those populations to assist them in their preparedness efforts.	
Staff and Family Emergency Support – develop and implement staff and staff and family support systems before, during, and after emergencies to help assure staff report to work during emergencies.	
Healthcare Provider Outreach and Education – identify healthcare provider needs for disease identification and public health responses. Develop and implement information, tools, systems, and trainings/education to meet those needs.	

STRATEGIC INITIATIVE 3 – PROMOTING HEALTHY ENVIRONMENTS

Project Description	Status
EPH Document Imaging – complete imaging of EPH files to provide improved access to records and conserve file storage space.	
Develop Loan and Grant Program for OSS – provide low interest loans or lien based loans to low to moderate income homeowners who need to repair or replace failing septic systems.	
Assess Sustainability of Groundwater – determine long-term ground water resources and potential impact of development on these.	
Development of Unified Enforcement Code – ensure that local code is developed that supports program actions in areas of safe water, on-site, food, and tobacco.	
Natural and Sustainable Community Development – develop programs to advocate for health and sustainable community design.	
Public Education on Health Issues – enhance and ensure continuity of public education about health issues, beginning with EPH.	
Zoonotic Disease Response Plan – develop zoonotic disease program, including internal processes and response plan.	
Healthy Indoor Air – develop plan to address mold, radon, second hand smoke, and other pollutants impacting indoor air.	

STRATEGIC INITIATIVE 4 – IMPROVING HEALTH CARE ACCESS

Project Description	Status
Integrated Primary Care – develop integrated primary care and behavioral services clinic serving low income populations in the Center for Community Health.	
Project Access – develop volunteer specialty referral system for uninsured Clark County residents seen in primary care safety net.	
Explore and Develop Public Health Role in Local Access – Partner with community stakeholders to explore methods for improving access to health care in Clark County.	
Promote Evidence-Based Prevention in Primary Care and the Community – provide outreach to community partners and providers to improve the delivery of preventative services in primary care settings and the community.	

STRATEGIC INITIATIVE 5 – SUPPORTING GOOD HEALTH AT EVERY AGE

Project Description	Status
Initiate a NFP Team – launch one Nurse Family Partnership Team	
Promote Community, Home and School Environments that Increase Physical Activity and Healthy Nutrition and Reduce Disease Risk – develop a comprehensive physical activity and nutrition plan to guide public health's efforts to reduce obesity and related chronic disease.	
Conduct a Comprehensive Community Health Assessment – conduct comprehensive community health assessment, including catalog of community resources and gap analysis, to identify need for new team-based intervention strategies for specific age groups.	
Launch and Lead New, Team-Based Health Promotion Initiatives that Address Every Stage of Life – create and fund multi-disciplinary, community-focused teams that develop and implement researched-based prevention strategies appropriate to each stage of life.
