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First Public Health for State's Medicaid Waiver Proposal Set for Bowling Green

Governor Matt Bevin, along with state health officials, last week unveiled a comprehensive plan to transform Kentucky's Medicaid program, known as Kentucky HEALTH (Helping to Achieve Long Term Health). As a first step towards the implementation of the plan, the Cabinet for Health and Family Services announced a comprehensive Section 1115 waiver application proposal for Kentucky.
