

# Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE)

**Purpose:** Guided by the Recovery-Oriented Systems-of Care-Framework, the purpose of the KORE is to implement a comprehensive, targeted response to Kentucky’s opioid crisis by expanding access to a full continuum of high quality, evidence-based opioid prevention, treatment, recovery support services.
