
Melinda is one of 17 honorees recognized by CAC Kentucky


to ensure they have met stringent guidelines. Most importantly, 100% of collected pledges goes directly to help others!

Legislative Update

DCBS Commissioner Marta Miranda-Straub and Director of Family Support Jason Dunn presented to the Health, Welfare, and Family Services Interim Joint Committee on Dec.15. They spoke about child welfare and the provision of Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) benefits to assist in purchasing meals for school children who would have received free or reduced lunch if attending in-person school during the pandemic. Division of Protection and Permanency Assistant Director Melanie Taylor answered legislators' questions on abuse referrals and reporting policy.
