MFP Program Overview

In 2007, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) awarded funds for 46 states to start *Money Follows the Person* demonstration grant programs (MFP)

O There are 47 active MFP programs

O Since inception, over 100,000 individuals transitioned using MFP programs



MFP Program Overview

MFP Goals:

- Increase the use of home and community-based services (HCBS) and reduce the use of institutionally-based services
- C Eliminate barriers in state law, state Medicaid plans, and state budgets that restrict the use of Medicaid funds to enable Medicaid-eligible individuals to receive support for appropriate and necessary longterm services and supports in the settings of their choice



MFP Goals:

Strengthen the ability of Medicaid programs to provide HCBS to people who choose to transition out of institutions

O Put procedures in place to provide quality assurance and improve HCBS



Kentucky Transitions Program

- In 2007, Kentucky Transitions was created to administer the MFP program in Kentucky
- O Designed to assist Medicaid members who reside in inpatient facilities choosing to return to the community
- Since 2008, Kentucky Transitions has moved over 860 individuals from institutional facilities to community setting
- O Participants moved to residences in 103 of the 120 counties in Kentucky

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Kentucky Transitions Program

To align with the Home Community-Based Services Waivers HCB, ABI-LTC, and SCL, *Kentucky Transitions* targets the following populations:

- O Physically disabled HCB
- Gerly (≥65 years) HCB
- O Persons with a primary diagnosis of Mental Illness HCB or SCL
- O Acquired Brain Injuries HCB or ABI-LTC
- O Persons with primary diagnosis of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities - SCL



Eligibility

Who is Eligible?

Anyone that is:

Cliving in an institution/nursing facility for a minimum of 60 days

O Meets nursing facility level of care

O Medicaid eligible, not with a subsidized Medicaid benefit plan (MAGI, Exparte, etc.)

O Able to live in the community with supports and services



Benefits

- **O** Full transition planning and support
- Continuity of Care- ensures individuals have a waiver slot when completing the 365-days of services
 No "Wait List" for waiver services
- Pre-Transition expenses for household setup
 Assistance allowing up to \$2,500*
- Home modifications assistance for accessibility
 Lesser of \$15K or 10% PVA*

*One-Time use per person (lifetime)



Pre-Transition Allowable Expenses

- O Housing Security Deposit includes first month's rent
- O Household set up includes furnishings, bedding, linens and dishes
- G Kitchen set up, laundry and cleaning supplies along with necessities
- Food stock sufficient for sustenance
- O Durable medical equipment with a physician's order
- O Pre-Transition transportation
- Pest eradication



Housing Benefits

- O Networks with housing authorities to locate affordable, accessible, and safe housing options
- Assists participants with completion of housing applications and leasing agreements
- Complete Housing Quality Standards Inspection on nonsubsidized housing units
- O Home modifications assistance for accessibility -Entry ramps, door widening, bathroom accessibility, etc.
