Documentation of Early Intervention Services

We appreciate some providers documenting their early intervention sessions as soon as the session ends. Timely documentation ensures they can remember all the important details and get their notes submitted within the required time frame. Please make sure the child and family have received the entire amount of time authorized on the IFSP before documenting. Writing notes at a family's home or at a childcare center does not count as early intervention time and is not a billable service.

Working in early intervention provides opportunities to form wonderful partnerships with caregivers.
