



# Kentucky COVID-19 New Cases by Week (n = 462,432)




## Distribution of Race/Ethnicity by KY Population, COVID-19 Cases, and COVID-19 Deaths


# Kentucky COVID-19 Deaths by Reported Date of Death (n = 7,163)







# 7-Day Average Daily Incidence Rate By County




## COVID-19 Incidence (Cases per 100,000) in the U.S., by State or Territory - June 14, 2021





# Kentuckians who have received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine


At Least One Dose - Cumulative by Week
