

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 9 members in Barren County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$686,245 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 183 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 6,145 people a month in Barren County, stretching over 2,775 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Barren River District Health Department: \$8,006,577

During fiscal year 2024, in Barren county there were 20 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 1,220 participants who received benefits totaling \$1,107,725.

There are 11 WIC-approved grocers in Barren County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 52 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county. (NOTE: 2023 and 2024 data is considered preliminary)

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Barren County received \$814,195 in funding for 3 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 7,935, and 57% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$370,301.

Additional grants totaled \$6,500.

Barren County received \$1,386,638 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 443 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,545 children, collecting \$3,481,293 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 2,121 orders.

There were 119 children cared for by foster families, 107 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$8,196.

31% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 68% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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Behavioral Health Services

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 12,718 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 39,583 of the 90,582 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,313 prescribers and 314 dispenser DEA numbers.

Barren County is served by the Lifeskills Community Mental Health Center. Lifeskills received \$9,957,965 in fiscal year 2024.

Lifeskills served 8,599 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Barren is located in the Lifeskills region. This region received \$1,196,899 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 406 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 270 background checks for children & elderly services in Barren county fiscal year 2024.
