

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 9 members in Boyle County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$357,958 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 92 households in the past fiscal year.

SNAP Program On average, SNAP supported 3,371 people a month in Boyle County, stretching over 1,602 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$6,680,381

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# Health Services Funding to Boyle County Health Department: \$967,565 Adu During fiscal year 2024, in Boyle county there were 9 people

enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 542 participants who received benefits totaling \$571,668.

There are 4 WIC-approved grocers in Boyle County.

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Boyle County received \$477,279 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 4,703, and 55% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$285,204. Additional grants totaled \$3,000.

Boyle County received \$1,538,018 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 309 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,207 children, collecting \$1,889,310 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,280 orders.

There were 29 children cared for by foster families, 26 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,466.

34% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 65% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
