Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$161,501 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 41 households in the past fiscal year.

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## **Health Services**

Funding to Bracken County Health Department: \$600,476

During fiscal year 2024, in Bracken county there were 4 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco guitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 149 participants who received benefits totaling \$150,051.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Bracken County received \$183,617 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,465, and 56% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$74,508. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Bracken County received \$257,183 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 63 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 379 children, collecting \$624,064 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 334 orders.

There were 18 children cared for by foster families, 17 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,397.

44% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 55% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

## Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,336 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 6,135 of the 16,226 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,086 prescribers and 163 dispenser DEA numbers.
