Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Breckinridge County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$248,028 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 64 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 2,618 people a month in Breckinridge County, stretching over 1,221 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$5,071,881

During fiscal year 2024, in Breckinridge county there were 6 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Breckinridge County received \$361,935 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,976, and 55% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$141,498. Additional grants totaled \$1,300.

Breckinridge County received \$458,490 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 135 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,097 children, collecting \$1,671,215 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 976 orders.

There were 43 children cared for by foster families, 35 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,457.

46% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
53% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 6,139 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 18,514 of the 44,763 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,033 prescribers and 261 dispenser DEA numbers.

Breckinridge County is served by the Communicare Community Mental Health Center. Communicare received \$8,367,833 in fiscal year 2024.

Communicare served 8,252 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Breckinridge is located in the Communicare region. This region received \$982,617 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

## Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 248 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 257 background checks for children & elderly services in Breckinridge county fiscal year 2024.
