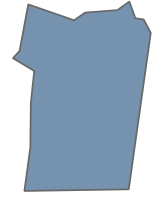

Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Christian County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$1,013,118 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 322 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 9,379 people a month in Christian County, stretching over 4,027 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$19,199,324

During fiscal year 2024, in Christian county there were 18 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 3,185 participants who received benefits totaling \$2,455,054.

There are 8 WIC-approved grocers in Christian County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Christian County received \$999,933 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 7,633, and 69% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$207,543. Additional grants totaled \$3,105.

Christian County received \$4,389,876 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 1,079 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 4,062 children, collecting \$7,723,219 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 3,479 orders.

There were 99 children cared for by foster families, 78 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$6,652.

31% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
68% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 14,384 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 37,849 of the 99,542 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,515 prescribers and 344 dispenser DEA numbers.
