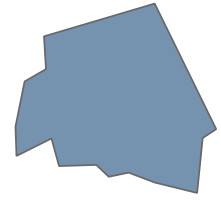

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Clark County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$627,991 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 169 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 4,852 people a month in Clark County, stretching over 2,338 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$9,818,431

Funding to Clark County Health Department:

During fiscal year 2024, in Clark county there were 16 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 978 participants who received benefits totaling \$949,649.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Clark County received \$570,360 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 5,397, and 59% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$863,037. Additional grants totaled \$3,100.

Clark County received \$4,141,697 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 747 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,714 children, collecting \$3,177,567 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,780 orders.

There were 106 children cared for by foster families, 89 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$7,638.

26% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
73% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 11,762 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 40,490 of the 92,575 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,718 prescribers and 419 dispenser DEA numbers.
