

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 7 members in Estill County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$299,897 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 85 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 3,008 people a month in Estill County, stretching over 1,528 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Estill County Health Department: \$824,448

During fiscal year 2024, in Estill county there were 7 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco guitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 327 participants who received benefits totaling \$296,836.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Estill County received \$309,563 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,156, and 63% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$259,882. Additional grants totaled \$1,500.

Estill County received \$546,294 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 134 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 592 children, collecting \$821,948 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 608 orders.

There were 64 children cared for by foster families, 50 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$5,235.

35% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 64% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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Behavioral Health Services

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,175 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 24,453 of the 49,235 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,529 prescribers and 234 dispenser DEA numbers.

The Office of Inspector General completed 189 background checks for children & elderly services in Estill county fiscal year 2024.
