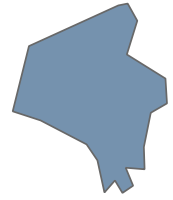

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 14 members in Fayette County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$4,039,925 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 1,141 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 28,972 people a month in Fayette County, stretching over 13,705 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$62,915,362

## Health Services

Funding to Lexington-Fayette County Health Department:  
\$4,743,997

During fiscal year 2024, in Fayette county there were 104 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 6,070 participants who received benefits totaling \$5,476,036.

There are 24 WIC-approved grocers in Fayette County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 1656 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county. (NOTE: 2023 and 2024 data is considered preliminary)

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Fayette County received \$3,583,943 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 39,675, and 54% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$1,915,500. Additional grants totaled \$18,877.

Fayette County received \$24,681,617 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 4,599 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 13,169 children, collecting \$16,837,973 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 12,975 orders.

There were 561 children cared for by foster families, 478 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$39,706.

35% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
64% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 76,741 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 166,710 of the 499,689 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 6,744 prescribers and 881 dispenser DEA numbers.
