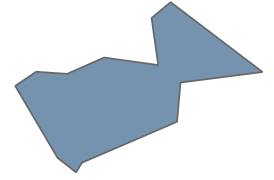

**AmeriCorps  
Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Gallatin County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$115,732 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 26 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 821 people a month in Gallatin County, stretching over 337 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$1,604,410

## Health Services

Funding to Three Rivers District Health Department:

During fiscal year 2024, in Gallatin county there were 6 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 204 participants who received benefits totaling \$199,186.

There are 1 WIC-approved grocers in Gallatin County.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Gallatin County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,480, and 71% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$88,511. Additional grants totaled \$10,000.

Gallatin County received \$396,212 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 85 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 333 children, collecting \$724,746 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 307 orders.

There were 5 children cared for by foster families, 4 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$141.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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## Behavioral Health Services

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,383 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 3,860 of the 8,719 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 898 prescribers and 125 dispenser DEA numbers.
