Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Gallatin County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,480, and 71% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$88,511. Additional grants totaled \$10,000.

Gallatin County received \$396,212 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 85 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 333 children, collecting \$724,746 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 307 orders.

There were 5 children cared for by foster families, 4 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$141.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
