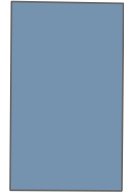

**AmeriCorps**  
Kentucky

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Graves County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$253,191 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 71 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 4,512 people a month in Graves County, stretching over 1,965 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$9,099,986

## Health Services

Funding to Graves County Health Department:  
\$2,204,436

During fiscal year 2024, in Graves county there were 11 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 831 participants who received benefits totaling \$745,514.

There are 6 WIC-approved grocers in Graves County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 64 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Graves County received \$645,419 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 5,871, and 57% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$372,150. Additional grants totaled \$20,450.

Graves County received \$1,954,016 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 458 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,614 children, collecting \$2,355,206 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,537 orders.

There were 79 children cared for by foster families, 69 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$6,066.

22% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
77% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 10,064 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 28,818 of the 77,031 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,408 prescribers and 209 dispenser DEA numbers.

Graves County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$7,247,573 in fiscal year 2024.

Four Rivers served 8,324 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Graves is located in the Four Rivers region. This region received \$1,585,068 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.
