

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$173,423 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 51 households in the past fiscal year.

Funding to Lake Cumberland District Health Department: \$10,844,684

During fiscal year 2024, in Green county there were 1 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 349 participants who received benefits totaling \$281,452.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Green County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,590, and 64% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$122,240.

Additional grants totaled \$0.

Green County received \$522,705 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 100 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 381 children, collecting \$724,826 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 329 orders.

There were 10 children cared for by foster families, 10 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,108.

50% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 50% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

According to KASPER data, 3,453 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 12,130 of the 27,666 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
