

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Hancock County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$65,622 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 17 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 888 people a month in Hancock County, stretching over 385 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Green River District Health Department: \$6,620,121

During fiscal year 2024, in Hancock county there were 2 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 149 participants who received benefits totaling \$136,615.

There are 1 WIC-approved grocers in Hancock County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 8 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county. (NOTE: 2023 and 2024 data is considered preliminary)

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Hancock County received \$184,042 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,480, and 52% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$138,016. Additional grants totaled \$2,000.

Hancock County received \$70,779 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 16 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 371 children, collecting \$972,100 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 299 orders.

There were 9 children cared for by foster families, 7 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$999.

22% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 77% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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Behavioral Health Services

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 1,943 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 4,625 of the 11,967 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 737 prescribers and 111 dispenser DEA numbers.

River Valley served 4,591 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Hancock is located in the River Valley region. This region received \$1,109,511 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 51 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 147 background checks for children & elderly services in Hancock county fiscal year 2024.
