Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Harrison County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$240,714 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 68 households in the past fiscal year.

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Health Services

During fiscal year 2024, in Harrison county there were 15 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 423 participants who received benefits totaling \$380,977.

There are 4 WIC-approved grocers in Harrison County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Harrison County received \$330,554 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,964, and 56% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$67,068. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Harrison County received \$1,170,256 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 259 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 821 children, collecting \$1,475,171 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 878 orders.

There were 78 children cared for by foster families, 65 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$4,033.

30% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 69% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 6,026 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 19,195 of the 44,958 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,734 prescribers and 272 dispenser DEA numbers.
