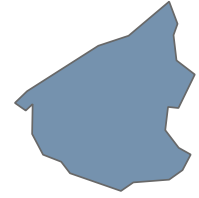

**AmeriCorps  
Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Hopkins County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$683,901 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 197 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 6,372 people a month in Hopkins County, stretching over 2,912 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$13,252,694

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## Health Services

Funding to Hopkins County Health Department:  
\$2,068,333

During fiscal year 2024, in Hopkins county there were 19 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 1,185 participants who received benefits totaling \$1,117,137.

There are 5 WIC-approved grocers in Hopkins County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 57 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Hopkins County received \$832,005 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 6,902, and 57% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$504,039. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Hopkins County received \$1,122,832 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 346 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,365 children, collecting \$4,132,329 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 2,200 orders.

There were 60 children cared for by foster families, 53 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$4,826.

26% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
73% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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## Behavioral Health Services

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 13,863 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 46,777 of the 107,019 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,412 prescribers and 325 dispenser DEA numbers.

The Office of Inspector General completed 1,424 background checks for children & elderly services in Hopkins county fiscal year 2024.
