Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 187 members in Jefferson County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$17,765,073 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 5,262 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 96,822 people a month in Jefferson County, stretching over 45,555 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$216,915,466


Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Jefferson County received \$9,359,852 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 92,808, and 63% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$2,106,377. Additional grants totaled \$72,841.

Jefferson County received \$75,241,983 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 13,044 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 37,346 children, collecting \$48,512,401 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 38,049 orders.

There were 907 children cared for by foster families, 755 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$62,965.

37% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.62% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
