Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 13 members in Kenton County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Kenton County received \$2,112,454 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 20,141, and 57% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$445,658. Additional grants totaled \$24,500.

Kenton County received \$11,504,708 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 1,955 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 8,661 children, collecting \$16,670,305 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 8,867 orders.

There were 480 children cared for by foster families, 400 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$38,219.

32% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 67% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
