

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 20 members in Knott County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$510,921 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 137 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 3,753 people a month in Knott County, stretching over 1,883 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Kentucky River District Health Department: \$7,233,479

During fiscal year 2024, in Knott county there were 1 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 372 participants who received benefits totaling \$352,781.

There are 1 WIC-approved grocers in Knott County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Knott County received \$354,514 in funding for 2 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,137, and 71% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$280,771.

Additional grants totaled \$0.

Knott County received \$49,648 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 24 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,065 children, collecting \$1,190,424 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,100 orders.

There were 40 children cared for by foster families, 40 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$3,927.

27% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 72% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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Behavioral Health Services

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,078 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 26,956 of the 55,415 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,202 prescribers and 243 dispenser DEA numbers.

Kentucky River served 3,769 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Knott is located in the Kentucky River region. This region received \$2,141,273 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.
