


## **Lincoln County - Fiscal Year 2024**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 11 members in Lincoln County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$400,373 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 110 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 4,097 people a month in Lincoln County, stretching over 1,863 households.

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### **Health Services**

Funding to Lincoln County Health Department: \$1,002,444

During fiscal year 2024, in Lincoln county there were 11 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 445 participants who received benefits totaling \$441,402.

There are 4 WIC-approved grocers in Lincoln County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 18 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county.

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Lincoln County received \$431,905 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 3,296, and 66% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$207,811.

Additional grants totaled \$0.

Lincoln County received \$1,056,436 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 228 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,127 children, collecting \$1,706,572 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,121 orders.

There were 84 children cared for by foster families, 56 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$5,111.

45% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 54% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 7,371 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 24,918 of the 55,879 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,904 prescribers and 291 dispenser DEA numbers.

Lincoln County is served by the New Vista Community Mental Health Center. New Vista received \$15,984,022 in fiscal year 2024.

New Vista served 13,758 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Lincoln is located in the New Vista region. This region received \$8,885,960 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

### **Public Protection Services**

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 209 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 218 background checks for children & elderly services in Lincoln county fiscal year 2024.
