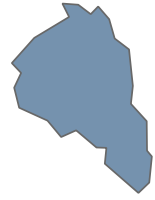

**AmeriCorps  
Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Magoffin County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$377,026 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 90 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 3,325 people a month in Magoffin County, stretching over 1,594 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$6,705,387

## Health Services

Funding to Magoffin County Health Department:  
\$955,078

During fiscal year 2024, in Magoffin county there were 7 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 359 participants who received benefits totaling \$389,417.

There are 2 WIC-approved grocers in Magoffin County.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Magoffin County received \$319,741 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,939, and 72% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$325,459. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Magoffin County received \$94,140 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 39 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 666 children, collecting \$902,121 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 709 orders.

There were 29 children cared for by foster families, 21 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,043.

37% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
62% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

**Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)**

According to KASPER data, 2,934 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 15,685 of the 31,566 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.


Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,002 prescribers and 183 dispenser DEA numbers.
