


# **McCracken County - Fiscal Year 2024**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 10 members in McCracken County.

## Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$1,019,307 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 283 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 7,804 people a month in McCracken County, stretching over 3,632 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$15,782,531

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# **Health Services**

Funding to Purchase District Health Department: \$3,432,229

During fiscal year 2024, in McCracken county there were 19 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 1,150 participants who received benefits totaling \$1,148,429.

There are 10 WIC-approved grocers in McCracken County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 188 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county.

# Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

McCracken County received \$970,461 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 10,169, and 53% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$227,550. Additional grants totaled \$1,950.

McCracken County received \$4,904,608 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 1,054 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 3,375 children, collecting \$4,827,233 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 2,976 orders.

There were 107 children cared for by foster families, 101 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$8,753.

38% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 61% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

# Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 23,672 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 65,875 of the 178,935 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,122 prescribers and 341 dispenser DEA numbers.

McCracken County is served by the Four Rivers Community Mental Health Center. Four Rivers received \$7,247,573 in fiscal year 2024.

Four Rivers served 8,324 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



McCracken is located in the Four Rivers region. This region received \$1,585,068 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

### **Public Protection Services**

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 638 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 1,402 background checks for children & elderly services in McCracken county fiscal year 2024.
