Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 6 members in McCreary County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$556,959 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 142 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 4,628 people a month in McCreary County, stretching over 2,066 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Lake Cumberland District Health Department: \$10,844,684

During fiscal year 2024, in McCreary county there were 11 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 745 participants who received benefits totaling \$874,785.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

McCreary County received \$381,654 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,712, and 79% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$317,893. Additional grants totaled \$20,863.

McCreary County received \$982,801 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 175 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,185 children, collecting \$1,282,629 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,328 orders.

There were 25 children cared for by foster families, 22 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,593.

20% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 80% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,606 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 21,577 of the 42,290 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
