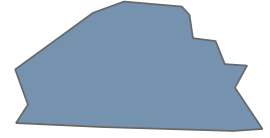

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Monroe County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$172,818 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 52 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 2,049 people a month in Monroe County, stretching over 916 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$3,968,934

During fiscal year 2024, in Monroe county there were 4 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Monroe County received \$221,995 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,841, and 67% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$62,900. Additional grants totaled \$1,500.

Monroe County received \$183,132 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 78 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 562 children, collecting \$689,031 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 469 orders.

There were 11 children cared for by foster families, 10 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,205.

9% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
90% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,861 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 10,784 of the 23,661 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 817 prescribers and 132 dispenser DEA numbers.

Monroe County is served by the Lifeskills Community Mental Health Center. Lifeskills received \$9,957,965 in fiscal year 2024.

Lifeskills served 8,599 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Monroe is located in the Lifeskills region. This region received \$1,196,899 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 121 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 82 background checks for children & elderly services in Monroe county fiscal year 2024.
