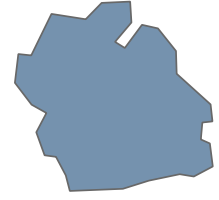

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Muhlenberg County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$596,488 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 155 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 4,775 people a month in Muhlenberg County, stretching over 2,081 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$9,649,123

Funding to Muhlenberg County Health Department:

During fiscal year 2024, in Muhlenberg county there were 14 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Muhlenberg County received \$510,780 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 4,415, and 58% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$171,054. Additional grants totaled \$28,000.

Muhlenberg County received \$926,324 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 289 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,320 children, collecting \$2,137,369 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,248 orders.

There were 43 children cared for by foster families, 30 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,818.

41% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
58% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 9,880 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 36,246 of the 85,144 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,725 prescribers and 281 dispenser DEA numbers.
