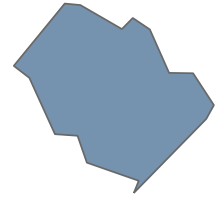

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Nicholas County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$138,673 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 37 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,103 people a month in Nicholas County, stretching over 514 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$2,205,766

Health Services

During fiscal year 2024, in Nicholas county there were 1 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Nicholas County received \$95,413 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,088, and 64% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$93,311. Additional grants totaled \$0.

Nicholas County received \$280,581 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 48 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 398 children, collecting \$760,718 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 432 orders.

There were 7 children cared for by foster families, 7 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$775.

14% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
85% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 2,371 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 8,730 of the 19,724 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,115 prescribers and 171 dispenser DEA numbers.
