


# **Owen County - Fiscal Year 2024**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Owen County.

#### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$122,047 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 30 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 1,284 people a month in Owen County, stretching over 570 households.

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## **Health Services**

Funding to Three Rivers District Health Department: \$3,767,301

During fiscal year 2024, in Owen county there were 6 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco guitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 220 participants who received benefits totaling \$212,147.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Owen County received \$178,953 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,740, and 56% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$80,169. Additional grants totaled \$145,800.

Owen County received \$223,922 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 54 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 462 children, collecting \$715,028 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 441 orders.

There were 26 children cared for by foster families, 21 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,879.

0% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

100% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

## Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 3,411 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 10,557 of the 23,838 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,837 prescribers and 259 dispenser DEA numbers.

Owen County is served by the Northkey Community Mental Health Center. Northkey received \$8,885,431 in fiscal year 2024.

Northkey served 9,276 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Owen is located in the Northkey region. This region received \$2,474,953 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

#### **Public Protection Services**

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 106 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 143 background checks for children & elderly services in Owen county fiscal year 2024.
