Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

Additional grants totaled \$10,000.

Powell County received \$836,071 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 171 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 890 children, collecting \$1,094,456 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 901 orders.

There were 27 children cared for by foster families, 22 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,935.

37% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 62% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
