Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Russell County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$385,664 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 97 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 3,404 people a month in Russell County, stretching over 1,659 households.

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Health Services

Funding to Lake Cumberland District Health Department: \$10,844,684

During fiscal year 2024, in Russell county there were 8 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 614 participants who received benefits totaling \$579,343.

There are 3 WIC-approved grocers in Russell County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Russell County received \$381,654 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 3,083, and 69% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$100,239.

Additional grants totaled \$7,300.

Russell County received \$1,255,888 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 272 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,147 children, collecting \$1,474,884 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,206 orders.

There were 60 children cared for by foster families, 29 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,511.

1% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.

98% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 5,543 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 22,051 of the 47,176 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
