

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 2 members in Scott County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$469,823 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 127 households in the past fiscal year.



On average, SNAP supported 4,428 people a month in Scott County, stretching over 1,948 households.

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Health Services

During fiscal year 2024, in Scott county there were 18 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 866 participants who received benefits totaling \$824,953.

There are 4 WIC-approved grocers in Scott County.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Scott County received \$787,479 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 9,946, and 40% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$251,637.

Additional grants totaled \$100.

Scott County received \$2,700,736 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 552 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,824 children, collecting \$3,861,740 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,895 orders.

There were 211 children cared for by foster families, 172 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$16,410.

58% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 41% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 16,872 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 41,871 of the 107,004 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 3,365 prescribers and 539 dispenser DEA numbers.

The Office of Inspector General completed 1,545 background checks for children & elderly services in Scott county fiscal year 2024.
