Todd County received \$379,143 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 97 providers a year. The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 531 children, collecting \$908,163 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 503 orders.

There were 20 children cared for by foster families, 16 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,934.

35% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 65% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).
