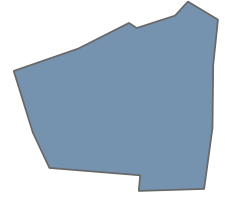

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Trigg County.

Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$108,896 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 32 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,571 people a month in Trigg County, stretching over 682 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$3,032,383

During fiscal year 2024, in Trigg county there were 6 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.

Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Trigg County received \$190,827 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 1,991, and 60% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$25,276. Additional grants totaled \$4,000.

Trigg County received \$468,865 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 114 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 483 children, collecting \$1,032,284 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 442 orders.

There were 25 children cared for by foster families, 18 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,057.

12% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.
88% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,260 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 10,918 of the 27,953 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,273 prescribers and 193 dispenser DEA numbers.

Trigg County is served by the Pennyroyal Community Mental Health Center. Pennyroyal received \$7,547,029 in fiscal year 2024.

Pennyroyal served 9,127 individuals in their region in fiscal year 2024.



Trigg is located in the Pennyroyal region. This region received \$877,399 in Kentucky Overdose Response Effort (KORE) funding for fiscal year 2024.

Public Protection Services

The Office of the Ombudsman responded to 96 constituent contacts in fiscal year 2024 in your county.

The Office of Inspector General completed 48 background checks for children & elderly services in Trigg county fiscal year 2024.
