Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 1 members in Union County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$183,011 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 52 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 1,670 people a month in Union County, stretching over 717 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$3,304,523

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Union County received \$250,195 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 2,077, and 59% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$75,416. Additional grants totaled \$9,288.

Union County received \$468,305 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 134 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 996 children, collecting \$2,076,774 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 982 orders.

There were 24 children cared for by foster families, 15 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$1,424.

20% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
79% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 4,272 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 12,694 of the 34,162 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.
