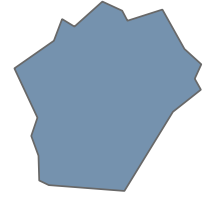

Kentucky**

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 0 members in Wayne County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$509,338 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 126 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 4,973 people a month in Wayne County, stretching over 2,302 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$9,400,050

# Health Services

Funding to Lake Cumberland District Health Department: \$10,844,684

During fiscal year 2024, in Wayne county there were 7 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 853 participants who received benefits totaling \$720,864.

There are 2 WIC-approved grocers in Wayne County.

Between the start of the HIV Epidemic (1982) and June 2024, there were 17 diagnosed cases of HIV in your county. (NOTE: 2023 and 2024 data is considered preliminary)

### Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Wayne County received \$381,654 in funding for 1 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 3,035, and 74% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$121,639. Additional grants totaled \$24,300.

Wayne County received \$2,207,880 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 417 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 1,295 children, collecting \$1,432,158 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 1,284 orders.

There were 30 children cared for by foster families, 21 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$2,915.

20% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption. 6 child(ren) adopted

80% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 6,564 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 30,425 of the 58,655 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 1,400 prescribers and 221 dispenser DEA numbers.
