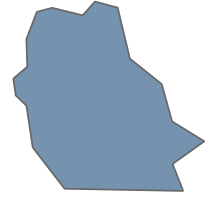

**AmeriCorps**  
Kentucky

Serve Kentucky manages AmeriCorps programs across the entire Commonwealth of Kentucky. 696 AmeriCorps members served 670,641 hours and earned \$2,562,242 in education awards. AmeriCorps members recruited 4,213 volunteers who provided 155,955 hours of volunteer service (valued at \$4,959,369). AmeriCorps members served 74,078 students and provided food support services to 3,344 students. Serve Kentucky also provided housing services to 465 individuals and collected 153,345 pounds of food for individuals facing food insecurity.

AmeriCorps has 9 members in Whitley County.

### Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (KTAP)

Your county received \$1,203,608 in KTAP issuance. This has been allocated to 298 households in the past fiscal year.

On average, SNAP supported 8,734 people a month in Whitley County, stretching over 3,902 households. Total SNAP spending in your county in fiscal year 2024: \$18,151,273

## Health Services

Funding to Whitley County Health Department:  
\$2,212,307

During fiscal year 2024, in Whitley county there were 34 people enrolled in Quit Now Kentucky (no-cost tobacco quitline), QUIT Now Kentucky provided 3,947 coaching sessions across the Commonwealth.



Your county has 1,278 participants who received benefits totaling \$1,483,153.

There are 9 WIC-approved grocers in Whitley County.

## Division of Family Resource and Youth Services Centers (FRYSC)

Whitley County received \$665,138 in funding for 3 school district(s). The total student enrollment for schools served by FRYSC was 7,880, and 65% of these students were eligible for free or reduced school lunch. Donations and volunteer time totaled \$668,212. Additional grants totaled \$9,961.

Whitley County received \$1,051,660 from the Child Care Assistance Program issuance, supporting up to 292 providers a year.

The Division of Child Support Enforcement served 2,471 children, collecting \$2,209,400 in current and past due child support, during fiscal year 2024. The agency established 2,300 orders.

There were 91 children cared for by foster families, 79 of whom received a combined per-diem totaling \$7,094.

38% of children in foster care had a goal of adoption.  
61% had a goal other than adoption (e.g. reunification).

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## Behavioral Health Services



### Kentucky All Schedule Prescription Electronic Reporting (KASPER)

According to KASPER data, 12,003 unique patients residing in your county received a pharmaceutical controlled substance. Opioid analgesics accounted for 52,397 of the 113,811 total controlled prescriptions dispensed.

Residents of your county received these prescriptions from 2,187 prescribers and 329 dispenser DEA numbers.
