

What is a quality improvement (QI) storyboard?

QI storyboarding is an organized way of documenting and showcasing the quality improvement process conducted by a team that is working systematically to resolve a specific problem and/or improve a given process. Storyboards use simple, clear statements as well as pictures and graphs to describe a problem, summarize the analysis process while it is under way, describe the solution and its implementation, and display the results and next steps.

When should I create a storyboard?

CPM suggests that every project create a storyboard to assist in the documentation and sharing of various projects. We recommended that you <u>develop your storyboard as the QI projects are taking place</u>. You will likely refine and revise the storyboard throughout the course of the project. Storyboards can also help to serve as an ongoing visual record of a team's progress, helping to keep team members focused on the task while sharing their progress with others.

What are the basic components of a storyboard?

The final storyboard should include the following components.

- 1) Problem Statement: Write a description of the situation/problem.
- 2) Aim Statement: Write the project aim statement using SMART objectives.
- **3) Process Outline & Relevant Data:** Outline the current procedures/approach in relationship to the project. Share data collected in regards to the current process.
- 4) Identify Possible Causes: Determine & explain root causes that contribute to the identified problem.
- 5) Identify Possible Solutions: Identify and prioritize possible solutions.
- 6) Improvement Theory: Describe the intervention and possible outcome.
- 7) **Test the Theory:** Explain how the improvement was implemented sharing relevant data, problems and/or observations.
- 8) Study the Results: Use data collected to study results of the test.
- 9) Standardize or Develop New Theory: Explain if you achieved the intended results and if you should adopt, adapt or abandon the improvement.
- 10) Outline Future Plans: Describe how you will proceed with this project or any next steps.

Where can I view sample storyboards?

While several national organizations have example storyboards, CPM has also implemented use of Dropbox as a file sharing system for LHD Accreditation Coordinators. The <u>KY Accreditation</u> <u>Coordinator</u> folder in the system contains various information including sample storyboards and storyboard templates. Tips for Developing QI Storyboards

Below are some general tips to consider in the development of QI Storyboards:

- Be concise and only include critical information.
- Consider the visual appeal of your storyboard and place graphics throughout.
- Avoid slang when possible.

- Make sure your purpose and final outcome can be clearly identified.
- Present plans for sustaining the improvement or further investigation.
