Mission

Kentucky's Child Fatality Review System

The Child Fatality Review System is the state's response to childhood deaths: a system designed to learn what we can from the children who died and develop strategies to prevent childhood deaths in the future.

The death of a child is a tragic loss to families, friends and communities. At times we struggle to understand the facts and information leading up to the event. In some cases, we may never know why a child dies or have answers to many questions. In other cases, the reasons for the death are complex and are the result of many factors.



- it impacts everyone.
- many cases are preventable.
- in Kentucky there were
 603 deaths of children age 17 and under for
 2008, which is a decrease of 2.8% from 2007.
- nationwide, the death rate of infants under the age of one year has leveled off.
- In 2008, Kentucky's infant mortality rate decreased by 3.1%, but this number is still preliminary.

Leading Cause of Death in KY

Infants:

- Prematurity-related
- Birth Defects
- SIDS/SUDI (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome/Sudden Unexpected Death in Infancy)



Children: (ages 1-17)

- Unintentional Injuries (motor vehicle accidents, suffocation of infants/co-sleeping)
- Birth Defects
- Diseases of the Nervous System
- Malignant Neoplasm
- Violent death (Homicide, Suicide)

Grief and Bereavement

Every county coroner leads their local Child Fatality team and coordinates with other local agencies to provide services to the grieving family. The local health departments offer grief counseling and bereavement services to the family when a child dies. For more information about these services contact your local health department.
